

The fusion and innovation of musical styles in jazz saxophone performance

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Abstract: Jazz saxophone, as a type of wind instrument in jazz music, has a unique tone, strong expressiveness and compatibility, and can therefore be integrated with various music styles. On this basis, with the development of the times, the music and art of various regions in the modern world have begun to blend, giving birth to many new forms of music. Therefore, jazz saxophone performance should also make corresponding innovations. This article analyzes the feasibility of combining jazz saxophone with different music styles and proposes several strategies for integration and innovation, in order to provide reference for jazz saxophone players.

1. Introduction

Jazz is a free and casual form of music that requires performers to explore on their own during its development, while also needing to innovate according to the changes of the times. Jazz saxophone is a wind instrument that lies between the flute and harp, with strong expressive power. Its unique tone can showcase different artistic charms in different styles of music. 2. The feasibility of combining jazz saxophone with different music styles

2.1. Jazz saxophone playing has strong compatibility

Jazz saxophone is a highly compatible instrument that can blend with multiple music styles. The sound of jazz saxophone has strong fluidity and can be well coordinated with other instruments during performance. Jazz saxophone can adjust the playing speed according to the player's own characteristics during the performance process. At the same time, when playing jazz saxophone, it is possible to effectively imitate and learn from other instruments, making jazz saxophone more compatible. In practical applications, jazz saxophone can not only blend with various music styles, but also with other instruments. Therefore, jazz saxophone has strong compatibility and artistic quality[1].

2.2. Jazz saxophone itself can be used for ensemble performances

Jazz saxophone can be used for ensemble performances, as it can play the bass part in indoor band ensembles or in outdoor band ensembles. Jazz saxophone was used in the early days to accompany jazz music and played as a percussion instrument. Since the 1960s, jazz saxophone has gradually become familiar to people due to its timbre, playing techniques, and technical difficulty.

The timbre of jazz saxophone can be well combined with other instruments during performance, resulting in richer and more delicate musical expressions. Due to its strong expressive power and substitutability, jazz saxophone can be used as a solo instrument in ensemble performances. At the same time, some people believe that using jazz saxophone in performance may result in poor performance, because the sound of jazz saxophone itself is relatively thin and lacks resonance. Therefore, if it is combined with other instruments in performance, more emotional resonance can be obtained [2-3].

2.3. Jazz saxophone performance can exist in any section of the repertoire

The sections of performance repertoire can generally be divided into six parts, each with different functionalities (see Table 1 for details). Therefore, in theory, it is necessary to use appropriate instruments to ensure smooth performance. Most music cannot be used for all sections, while jazz saxophone can be used for all sections. Combining this, jazz saxophone can be inserted into any musical style, making it feasible to combine jazz saxophone with other musical styles[4].

3. Innovative strategies for integrating jazz saxophone with other music styles

3.1. Combining classical music with jazz saxophone

In the process of playing jazz saxophone, the performer needs to understand the content and form of classical music, and based on this, choose appropriate playing methods for integration. In addition, jazz saxophonist also needs to effectively utilize the heavy bass in their works. For example, when using "4" as the main melody in a work, the performer can perform it in one or two bars. This method can effectively reduce the impact of stress on saxophone timbre.

3.2. Combining Jazz with Contemporary Pop Music

Jazz saxophonist can combine contemporary popular music with jazz music, integrating it with jazz saxophone performance, further enriching the forms of jazz saxophone performance, and

enhancing the artistic value of jazz saxophone performance. For example, performers can integrate the rhythm of popular music with the melody of jazz saxophone playing. In this process, performers can add some simple keyboard rhythms, electronic instrument rhythms, etc., and use various playing methods such as glissando and vibrato to preserve the characteristics of jazz saxophone sound while also making the music more modern[7].

In addition, there are performers who can combine pop music with jazz, such as combining pop music with jazz. In this way, not only can the beauty and artistic value of music be enhanced, but also the expression forms of jazz saxophone performance can be enriched. For example, performers can use various methods such as "skewing" to perform popular music, and on this basis, add melodies and other elements of jazz saxophone performance. This can showcase the charm of different music and achieve a complementary effect during performance. Therefore, the fusion of popular music and jazz music through jazz saxophone has experimental value[8].

3.3. Integration of Multi Element Music Styles

There are many styles of playing jazz saxophone, among which the most common are shown in Table 2.

The main characteristic of these three music styles is that their rhythms are relatively cheerful, and there are often more stresses during performance. Therefore, jazz saxophonist can combine these music styles in their performance and apply them to their own playing practice. For example, in jazz music, its most prominent characteristics are freedom and casualness, so improvisational jazz is one of the most representative styles. The performance techniques of this style are usually characterized by melodic changes, and the goal of "attracting attention" is achieved by playing such musical works. Therefore, when playing jazz saxophone, the performer should choose the corresponding music according to their own requirements for the melody of the music, and integrate them according to the characteristics of different music pieces. For example, when playing 'Canon', the music melody is relatively cheerful, but if the performer plays Canon in a traditional way during the performance, it will make the music monotonous and boring. Therefore, jazz saxophonist can attract the audience's attention by changing this style[9].

In addition to the aforementioned musical styles, jazz saxophone can also be integrated with classical music to enrich the form of one's own musical works. For example, when playing Beethoven's Sonata, the music contains many classic fragments from classical music, and the performer can adapt these classic fragments by incorporating the melody and rhythm played by jazz saxophone, presenting a unique and rich jazz style to the audience.

3.4. Incorporating Traditional Chinese Music Elements

The development history of jazz saxophone music has a long and rich history. Therefore, in the process of playing jazz saxophone, innovation can also be combined with traditional Chinese music elements. The combination of jazz saxophone and traditional Chinese music elements can not only make music more ethnic, but also further enrich its musical connotations, allowing listeners to gain more cultural experiences.

For example, jazz saxophonist can perfectly combine ethnic characteristics with jazz saxophone

when playing "Descendants of the Dragon", making the music more imbued with ethnic charm. There are many ways to integrate traditional Chinese music elements into jazz saxophone performance, such as adapting traditional music, improvisation, and so on. Jazz saxophonist should choose one of the ways to innovate based on their own actual situation, so as to better spread and develop traditional Chinese culture. For example, adapting the "Dragon Boat Tune" and combining it with traditional Chinese instruments such as pipa and suona for performance can fully showcase the charm and heritage of Chinese traditional culture, while also making jazz saxophone music more ethnic[10].

3.5. Innovation in Performance Techniques

In order to integrate jazz saxophone with more musical styles and promote innovation, it is necessary to constantly update and innovate techniques to make it more in line with the style and characteristics of musical works and enhance the performance effect. For example, in jazz saxophone, there are many playing techniques that require players to constantly innovate, such as continuous short vibrato, vibrato, semi vibrato, and so on. In addition, enriching jazz saxophone performance can also be achieved through methods such as modulation and mixing. For example, in saxophone solo, many people use modulation, which can bring a refreshing feeling to the audience. By using modulation, players can adjust the timbre and expressiveness of the saxophone through their own understanding, making it more artistically infectious.

4. Conclusion

In summary, due to the strong compatibility of jazz saxophone itself, it can create richer performance effects when integrated with other instruments, making jazz saxophone performance in line with the times and promoting the development of jazz saxophone art in the new era. Jazz saxophonist should actively understand and master the characteristics and performance techniques of different music styles, and innovate their own performance skills based on this. And in the actual innovation process, attention should be paid to changing and innovating the sound of jazz saxophone, so that jazz saxophone can better keep up with the times and promote the better development of jazz music art.

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
